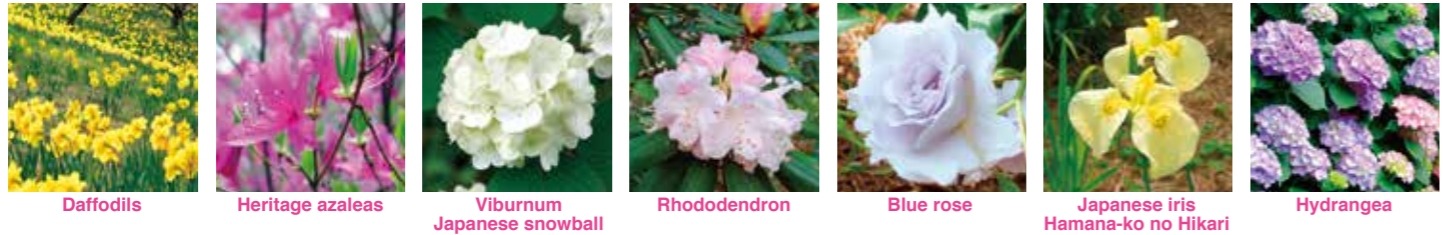

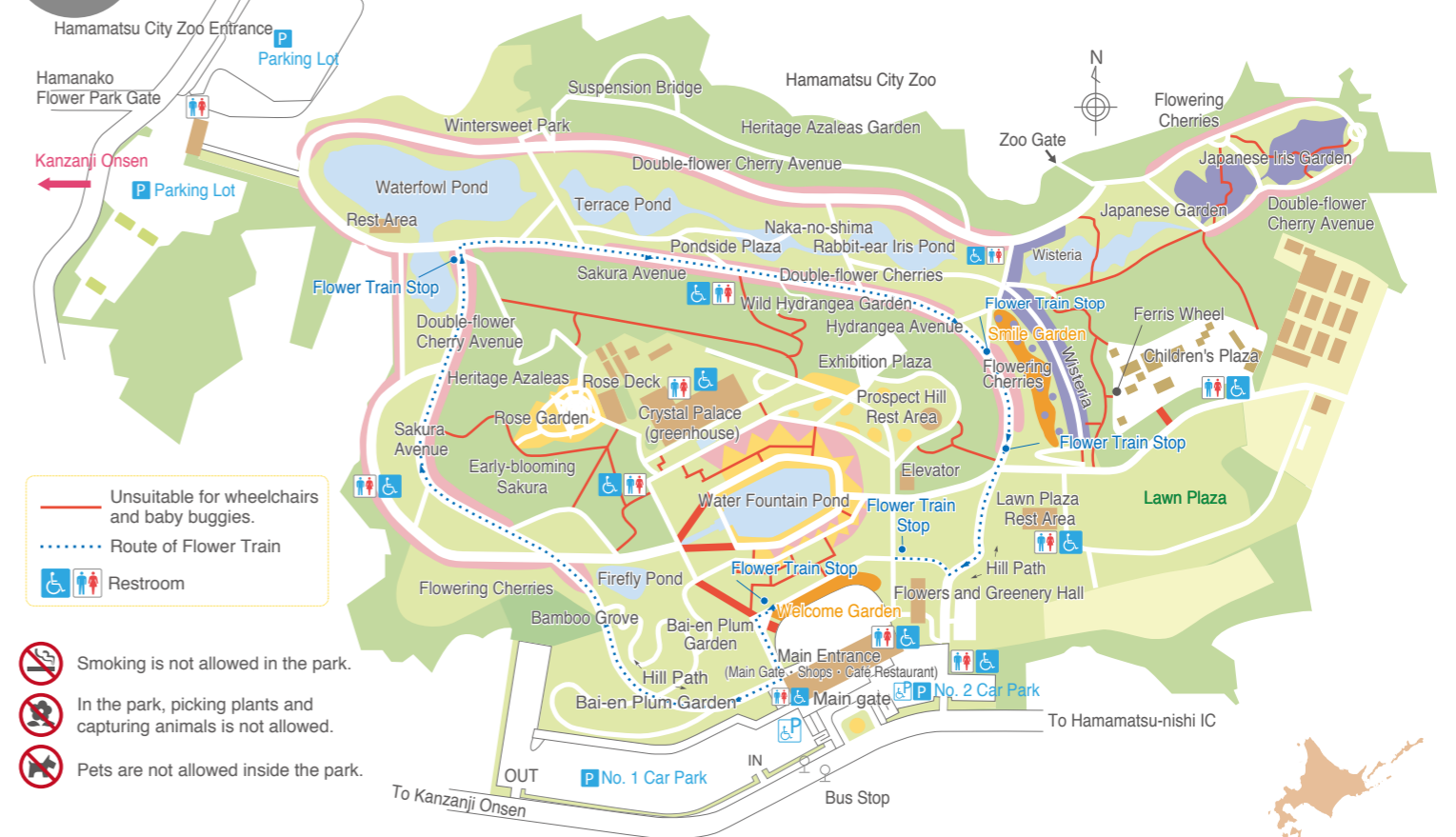
**From Konami Tsukamoto

Profile: Konami Tsukamoto
 In 1992, she was the first woman in Japan to qualify as a tree doctor.
 As well as promoting greening projects in Japan and overseas, she works to protect and treat old trees and large trees.
 In 1996, she successfully transplanted 130-year-old wisteria trees at Ashikaga Flower Park. She is currently the chairperson at Hamamatsu Flower Park.

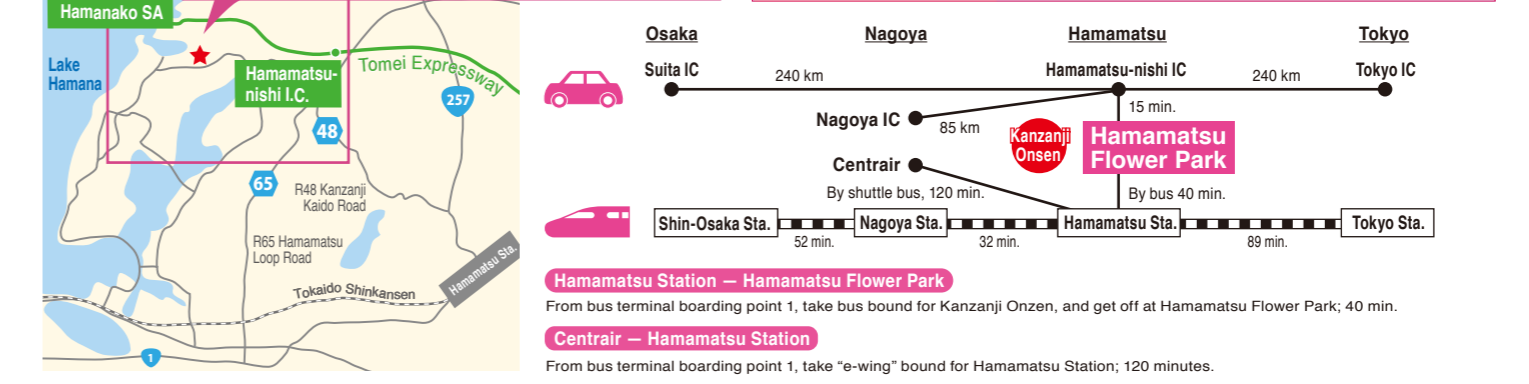
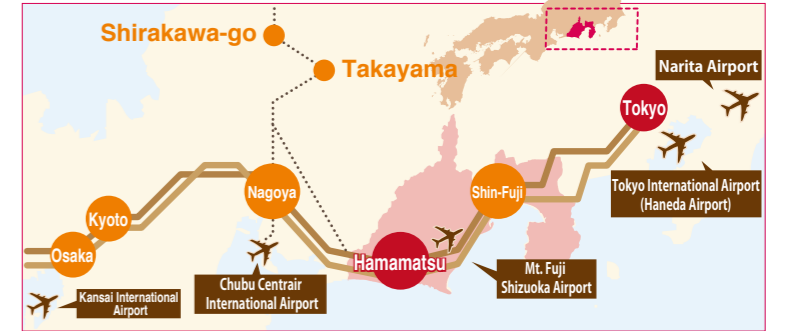
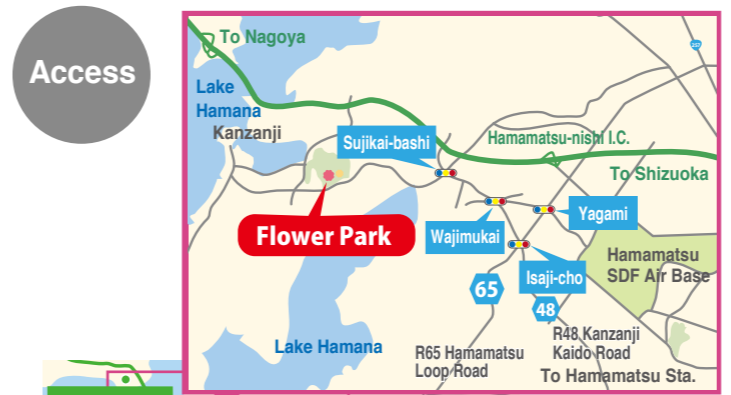


Park Map

Opening times and entrance fees during the Flower Festa

Annually from mid-March to mid-June
8:30-17:30 Extended hours for illuminations: 8:30-21:00
Sakura Light-up Late March to early April
Firefly Evening Late May to early June Entry to park until 30 min. before closing. **Open Daily**

Entrance Fee: Adult (high school age and over), 800-1,000 yen; Elementary and Middle School age, 400-500 yen When open in evening (entry fees after 18:00)
Adult (high school age and over), 600 yen; Elementary and Middle School age, 300 yen
 Preschool children, free. Please enquire about rates for groups of 15 persons or more, school discounts, persons with disability, etc.
 Entrance fees vary according to the beauty of the garden, which depends on how well the flowers are blooming and other conditions.
